#### Wayne and Bill's 310 Project

Things are getting closer now to having our Cessna 310s completed. Bill has caught up to Wayne in the process and is now taking the lead. They are both ready for the final painting process. Wayne is painting his own while Bill is hiring it done. Wayne is on hold while he works on a full size Cessna 172 that he has gone in on, to restore and sell someday, plus working on other projects as well.

Below is Bill's 310's parts in a primed condition waiting for the next steps to begin. The first step is to spray the parts with a primer-sealer coat. After that comes the polyurethane white base coat. The plane will be trimmed with Missile Red and pinstriped with black. All parts will be painted with clear coat for that glossy glass look. All painting should be completed by July 1st.
